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Cine y... publishes articles, interviews, and book reviews, generally in English. As its title, *Cine y...*, suggests, the journal seeks to publish studies which do more than study films in Spanish. *Cine y...* invites studies which look at film and society, history, literature, gender, psychology, etc. To be considered for publication, articles should study film(s) in Spanish from an interdisciplinary perspective. Articles and interviews of no longer than 15 double-spaced pages, Word- and MLA style-formatted, should be sent digitally to one of the editors listed below for review by the editorial board.

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
